

## Fresno Unified gets \$250,000 grant to improve citizenship applications

The Fresno Unified School District has received a \$250,000 grant to help permanent residents prepare and apply for U.S. citizenship through the Fresno Adult School.

With the grant, which is part of \$10 million worth in grants awarded by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, the school will expand citizenship instruction to better prepare residents for civics and English components of the naturalization test. The grant will provide federal funding until September 2016.

The Fresno Adult School has been providing citizenship application services to immigrants for more than 30 years.
