

## Fresno State among top 25 in awarding degrees to Latinos

Fresno State is ranked 21st nationally for the number of bachelor's degrees awarded to Latino students, according to Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education's annual Top 100 Colleges for Hispanics report.

During the 2013-14 academic year, 1,809 Latino students received a degree from Fresno State.

In other categories, Fresno State is ranked 38th for graduate student enrollment and 54th for undergraduate enrollment (two- and four-year schools).

The rankings were based on 2013-14 data from the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics.

A number of other California State University campuses were also recognized by the publication, which annually studies the top 100 predominantly Hispanic-serving, four-year colleges and universities in the U.S. and Puerto Rico.

Other CSU campuses in the top 25 are: Fullerton (No. 5), Northridge (No. 7), Long Beach (No. 8), San Diego (No. 10), Los Angeles (No. 11), San Bernardino (No. 17) and Pomona (No. 22).
